

FRACTALS, FAMILY, AND FEMURS

I was recently blessed by an amazing vacation that included snorkeling and a lot of relaxing. During some quiet time, I was contemplating the beauty of the ocean floor and God's amazing design for this world. And I was reminded of fractals. I'm not a math person, but I love fractals. Fractals are a curve or geometric figure, in which each part has the same statistical character as the whole. You can see a great example in the fern. Each blade has the same design as the frond, and each little pinna has the same design as the blade. Fractals are found throughout nature and I'm overjoyed every time I find one!

The people/family of God is a loose interpretation of a fractal. Every person is part of this family because God is The Father - that family is the fern. Nations, ethnicities, religions, governments, sects, etc. are the different fronds. Some of those "frond families" have lost their way from God, while others are more in tune with God's design and example - it's a dysfunctional family that is very healthy in some ways, but destructive in others. The "blades" might be denominations, and so on.

This continues to smaller and smaller sections of the fern until you get to the local church (which is made up of families). Cross Tracks Church follows the pattern of being a family made up of people who share the same blood and yet are very different. We are united in our love for this family and our efforts to grow in grace and in faith. God's design for this family is beautiful.

Which brings us to the femur. (Actually, the entire body, but I wanted to stick with the alliteration.) God gives us a great number of images of how we are called to work together; I'm fairly confident this is because no one metaphor can describe the complexity of God's plan for how God's people are to function in unity with one another. The Body of Christ is one of my favorite images because this is one of the clearest pictures of our dependence on one another.

Each one of us is a body part that contributes to the health and wholeness of this church. I helped my mom study for a nursing exam when I was in high school and I was SHOCKED by how much there was to memorize about the femur! The thigh bone shouldn't have 28 identifiable parts! But it is definitely a great example of the


importance of each individual in our church and a glimpse into the importance of each individual's complete health.

TRUSTEES

The Trustees are working on the following:

- 1. New Oven(s) for the Kitchen in the Worship Center
- 2. Rekeying the Campus in March (delayed from February due to the locksmith out with illness)
- 3. Annual Fire Inspection
- 4. Elevator Maintenance Contract / Inspection
- 5. HVAC Maintenance Contract (executed)
- 6. Shopping for Fire Suppression Hood for Kitchen
- 7. ... Lots more!

CHAPEL RENOVATION

We have just completed 2 "behind the scenes" projects that will reduce the electric utility bills and increase the electrical safety of the Chapel. 1) New HVAC units that are modern heat-pumps (rather than electric resistance elements), and 2) New Electrical Service panel and high voltage wiring.

What's next? The West Wing wall to the office has been removed, the carpet pulled up, and termite damage exposed. We are planning on removing the entire floor to evaluate the Pier and Beam floor supports, repairing as needed, then decking with plywood (due to budget constraints). That should complete what I call the 'safety / operating' items on our restoration list.

We will be working on the plans to remove the suspended ceiling, repairing (or replacing) the original pressed zinc tiles, reworking the HVAC ducting, and provide for new lighting as the next major phase. This will also include new base boards, repointing the plaster, and painting. My personal goal is to complete this by the end of 2023.

Staff, Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) Update

We're excited to welcome our new Church Office Administrator - Maria "MJ" Sotela who began on February 20th. MJ is from Costa Rica and brings a wealth of experience and energy to this key role for our Church.

MJ replaces Donna Huff who was our Church Office Administrator for the past year. During that time, Donna did a fantastic job and went above and beyond to ensure the Church runs smoothly each and every day. She was recently offered an exciting full-time opportunity in her career field, and we wish her the very best.

We are very blessed by both MJ and Donna!

Finance Committee

Current 2023 contributions are \$27,250 vs. a budget of \$36,000 through February 23rd. This is a 25% contribution shortfall.

FINANCE

Operating capital stands at \$39,982, which represents 1.3 months of anticipated expenditures for 2023.

As of mid-month, most budget items are within estimates, with the following exceptions:

- -Electricity is 25% over budget
- -Water and sewer are 75% over budget

We also have unplanned maintenance due to roof leaks and tree issues as a result of the storm.

Our facility loan has not adjusted for the increase in interest rates, nor has The Methodist Foundation resumed principal charges. When this occurs, our debt service will increase \$4,000 to \$5,000 a month.

Please prayerfully consider your financial support of the church so that we may avoid cash flow issues as the expenses as a result of the current environment increase.






