## SEASONS AND SONSHINE FRIENDS

On Tuesday, May 17th, the Church Board took the difficult vote to close operations of Sonshine Friends Preschool at the end of this year. This has been an important ministry of the church for many years. We reopened after Covid, which was not possible for many preschools and child care centers. Our teachers and director were committed to maintaining a premium preschool that equipped young learners for kindergarten while offering them the love and acceptance of Jesus and a good foundation in Bible stories.

Over the past year and a half, the efforts to keep the preschool fully staffed became more and more difficult. In mid-April our director had to resign due to health issues. Pam Turner stepped in immediately to learn everything she could from the director, Amy, so she could fill in until we hired a new director. Spencer Kendall and Mike Bowles also stepped up to share the director responsibilities and keep the preschool running smoothly. They are amazing and we are blessed by their faithfulness and their efforts. They have certainly earned brownie points in heaven!!

At the same time, we began the

search for a new director with great hope, but not much encouragement from professionals about the availability of good directors. After several weeks, we found a woman who had the professional gifts our preschool required and she had a passion for offering the gospel to children and their families. We had found the unicorn! We planned to have a Town Hall meeting with the parents to meet the new director.

Unfortunately, through a series of events, a small group of parents determined they did not approve of the new director and came to the meeting with their own agenda. The meeting did not go well and the director understandably resigned the following morning. To say we are disappointed in this outcome is an understatement!

Without a director, or enough teachers, we are unable to reopen in the fall of 2023.

Ecclesiastes 3:1–8 comes to mind, especially "a time to be born and a time to die," "a time to tear down and a time to build," "a time to mourn and a time to dance," "a time to tear and a time to mend." As this season ends, we find ourselves mourning the tearing down of a ministry that has blessed

many families. As people of God, we know that the close of this season brings with it the beginning of a new season.

We know that God has called us to ministry to children and youth and that God has a vision for Cross Tracks that will bless the families of our community. We are now called to a season of mending, gathering stones, planting, building, and eventually a time of dancing. The church board was already planning a season of discernment of God's purpose for Cross Tracks. We know that God wants us to have an impact on our community and we want to be faithful.

Our Board, our Children's Ministry Team, and anyone interested in building the future of our ministry for children and youth will begin the process of discerning God's plan and creating the blueprint and infrastructure to make it possible. We look forward to engaging the whole church in our future ministry focus. Check back for God's vision and next steps.


# CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

F.R.O.G. CLASS recently started a new study The Lord's Prayer. The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught by Adam Hamilton

When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, Jesus gave them this prayer. He likely taught it to his followers often, not just one time. He never intended the Lord's Prayer to be a museum piece, framed and placed on a mantel or in a display case. It was Jesus teaching God's people, through his disciples, how to pray.


In The Lord's Prayer. The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught, Hamilton guides us to really know—and really pray—the Lord's Prayer. He explores each of its rich lines and their meaning in the Bible, illuminating what we ask of God and what we ask of ourselves through its words. And he teaches us how to use it as a pattern for our own prayer life.



**L.I.F.E. CLASS** will be starting a new study on April 23rd, *Making Sense of the Bible*: Rediscovering the Power of Scripture Today By Adam Hamilton

Denominations from evangelical to mainline continue to experience deep divisions over universal social issues. The underlying debate isn't about a particular social issue, but instead it is about how we understand the nature of scripture and how we should interpret it. The world's bestselling, most-read, and most-loved book is also one of the most confusing.

In Making Sense of the Bible, Adam Hamilton, one of the country's leading pastors and Christian authors, addresses the hot-button issues that plague the church and cultural debate, and answers many of the questions frequently asked by Christians and non-Christians alike. Did God really command Moses to put gay people to death? Did Jesus really teach that everyone who is not a Christian will be assigned to hell? Why would Paul command women to "keep silent in the church?" Were Adam and Eve real people? Is the book of Revelation really about the end times? Who decided which books made it into the scriptures and why? Is the Bible ever wrong? In approachable and inviting language, Hamilton addresses these often-misunderstood biblical themes. leading readers to a deeper appreciation of the Bible so that we might hear God speak through it and find its words to be life-changing and life-giving.
