

We are moving to a quarterly newsletter because compiling and publishing a newsletter is exhausting! There are certain seasons that NEED a newsletter: holiday, Easter, summer, Back to School. We are very quickly approaching the holiday season! (Some would say Halloween is in the holiday season, so we're sneaking it in.)

I have to admit that my joy and anticipation of the holiday season is accompanied by a small amount of dread. I know that the next few months will be crammed with decorating, shopping, cooking/eating, gatherings, and special events. Each and every one of these things is wonderful and joyful on their own, but in their totality, it can sometimes feel like too much. I've heard people mutter, "I just can't wait for Christmas to be over" and I understand the sentiment, even as my heart hurts for the turn the holy days have taken.

The word holiday came from the term holy days. As you can see from the definition above, holidays have almost nothing to do with holiness any longer. Our Advent series is more than just a sermon series; I hope this becomes a new way of being each of us and for our church! The Advent Conspiracy is a movement that began over a decade ago between just a few pastors and churches and it has grown to include churches over the US.

There are four tenets to the Advent Conspiracy:



Worship Fully

In the chaos of Christmas, it is very easy to lose sight of our spiritual practices and perhaps even forego church for Christmas events. The Advent Conspiracy includes simple daily scripture readings to keep us grounded in Christ and worshiping God with all we are.



Spend Less

In our hearts we know mindless consumption is not the way to celebrate Jesus. But spending less does not mean spending nothing. We are invited to be intentional about how, where, and why we're using our resources.



Give More

The best gifts celebrate a relationship and most often they require our time and energy. Instead of giving "stuff", we will explore ways of giving more of ourselves.



Love All

Christmas is a chance to move closer to those in crisis. We will love others as Jesus has loved us. The poor and hurting of our world can be reached by God through the way we choose to celebrate Christmas.

I'm looking forward to how our participation in Advent Conspiracy will empower our giving in a significant way on Christmas Eve.



CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL

Children ages 4 years old through 5th grade are really enjoying the Cokesbury curriculum called "Grow, Proclaim Serve". This quarter (September through November) they are studying about Hannah, Samuel, David, Elijah, Josiah, and Huldah. We start off each week with chapel which includes a little wake up tune, watch a short video from the week's lesson and then share our joys and concerns. The students then go to small group. Currently chapel time and small group are both in the Education building.

ADVENT CONSPIRACY


Children, Youth and Adult Sunday School Classes will all be using the curriculum during December, "The Advent Conspiracy" to go along with the sermon series during the month of December.

Here are some of the things we are looking ahead to in the coming weeks—our 5th Sunday Luncheon and Trunk or Treat on Oct. 29th, All Saints Day is Nov. 5th, an Old-fashioned Hymn Sing in our Nov. 12th service, and Advent starts on Dec. 3rd.

You may have noticed a few minor changes in our services and we have had some good feedback on those. Since the Praise Band is doing more songs in the services, we are always looking for more singers and musicians for the band. If you are interested in joining on occasion, let me know. Our choir has just started up and we are looking forward to having them sing for us in the coming weeks. It's not too late to join them.

We also hope to have more of our people helping in the services as liturgists, ushers, greeters, acolytes, helpers with the children's space and nursery. There are positions in the AV room that some might be interested in-operators for the slides, sound board operators, and Facebook presenters. The more people we have means you don't have to do it so often. Let me know if you might be interested in learning more about these positions.

CONGRETIONAL CARE TEAM

As everyone has noticed the great changes to the Narthex and the reestablishment of the Breakfast Bar, the Congregation Care Team (CCT) has developed a new Greeter Program to help visitors be welcomed, provided information, and directed to the activities they wish to participate in.

The kickoff for the Greeters will be the Sunday, 22 nd of October, when you will see our Greeters in green vests in the parking lot and Narthex.

A signup roster, for two Congregate volunteers each Sunday to be Greeters, will be circulated on the 22 nd with the intent everyone helps welcome and support our goal of welcoming our visitors, the community and representing our Church.

A program explanation and instructive guide will be available for those acting as Greeters along with a member of CCT present to help when Greeters arrive at 8:30 on Sunday mornings.

Keep in mind this is an evergreen program which will change with experience and input. We hope you will consider signing up... prayerfully and focused on our outreach in Liberty Hill.
